Step 1: Right-tap any blank area on the taskbar to open the context menu, choose Toolbars in the menu and click New toolbar. Step 2: In the window of New Toolbar- Choose a folder, select Desktop on the left list, choose Computer in the pop-up results, and tap Select Folder button.

A password reset disk is tied to your specific Windows 8 account, meaning that one has to be created from within Windows, back when you actually knew your password. In other words, if you don't already have a Windows 8 password reset disk, your chance to create one is over.

Note: you can rename This PC to My Computer by simply right-clicking and choosing Rename. Add the My Computer Icon to the Desktop in Windows 7, 8, or Vista Right-click on the desktop and choose Personalize, then click on “ Change Desktop Icons ” on the left-hand side of the screen.

How to Display the “ My Computer ” Icon on the Desktop in ...

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Step 1: Open the Desktop Icon Settings dialog by the method mentioned above. Step 2: Use the Restore Default setting to restore Computer icon. In the Desktop Icon Settings dialog box, select the current Computer icon, click Restore Default and tap OK.

On Windows-8.1 and 10 is called "This PC" (... see Image-2 Arrow-1)

Open the Charms bar. Place your mouse cursor in the top- or bottom-right corner of the screen, or press Win + C. The Charms bar will pop out from the right side of

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the screen. On a mobile device running Windows 8, you can swipe in from the right side of the screen.
